January 7, 2014 (Washington, DC) - Washington Project for the Arts (WPA) announces the dates for *SELECT 2015*, its 34th Annual Art Auction Exhibition and Gala. The curated exhibition will open Thursday, January 29 at 7 pm and will be on view Wednesday through Friday 4 – 11pm, Saturday noon – 5pm, and Sunday noon – 5pm, January 30 through March 6, 2015. *SELECT 2015* will be one of the last exhibitions held at Artisphere. The exhibition, which is free and open to the public, includes works by 104 emerging and established artists in a variety of media, selected by top curators from the region's most important institutions, notable independent curators, and the WPA Board of Directors. While the majority of participating artists reside in the Washington/Baltimore region, a number of established artists from outside the area will have works in the exhibition including Dana Schutz and Jason Gubbiotti.

Saturday, March 7, 2015 marks the **34th anniversary of the organization's highly-regarded art gala** that includes a **curated silent auction of more than 140 art works by top contemporary artists**, delicious dinner with a menu designed by chef R. J. Cooper, open bar, desserts, and DJ-fueled party with a (temporary) tattoo booth by artist Kelly Towles. **Tickets** to the auction gala start at \$325 and can be purchased by visiting the **WPA website** or contacting Nathalie von Veh at **nvonveh@wpadc.org** or 202-

234-7103 x5. WPA will be offering a \$150 party ticket with admission at 9pm. Bidding on artwork will commence the night of the gala. For information on bidding in absentia, please visit the WPA website or contact Nathalie von Veh. New this year, WPA will introduce bidding via BidPal where guests can bid from their mobile devices.

In advance of the March 7 gala event, WPA will host an exhibition opening reception on January 29 from 7:00 to 9:00 pm with wine & hors d'oeuvres from Peacock Cafe and two **Curator Talk** events on February 12 and 19 from 6:30 - 8:00 pm. These events, as well as the exhibition viewing, are free and open to the public. At each evening of the Curator Talks, a group of curators will discuss their exhibition selections. February 12 will feature talks by Jennifer Farrell, Ryan Holladay, Sarah Kennel, and Brian Young. February 19 will feature talks by Asantewa Boakyewa, Kristi-Anne Caisse, Sarah Hanley, and Phyllis Rosenzweig. The talks offer a wonderful opportunity to meet the curators and learn more about the works on view.

The exhibition and gala will be held at Artisphere, located just two blocks from the Rosslyn Metro station. **Free parking** with validation is available in the Artisphere garage weekdays after 5pm and all day on weekends. The event is expected to draw more than 700 artists and art enthusiasts.

ABOUT SELECT 2015

Now in its 34th year, the SELECT Art Auction Gala is WPA's most important fundraising event. Guests include more than 700 artists, collectors, arts professionals, and business leaders. The event supports WPA's mission to promote contemporary art and artists in the greater DC metropolitan region. Proceeds from the sale of art are split equally between the participating artists and WPA and go to support WPA's free programming all year round. This year's gala event is co-chaired by Jessica Naresh (The Art Registry), Judy J. Sherman (j fine art), Andrew J. Sherman (Jones Day), and Robert Shields (Robert Shields Interiors).
